ANNE KEPNER ON THE ISSUES

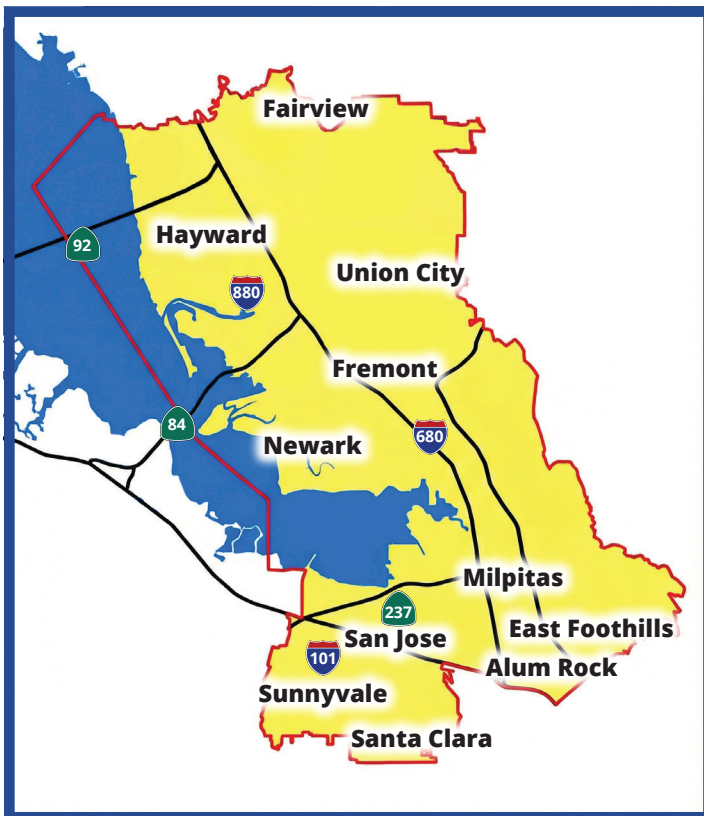
